

**“Zebegen” Style Art**  
(Grade 4 Print: “Zebegen” by Vasarely)

**Curriculum Connection:** Science and Math

**Art Concept:** Complimentary Colors and the color wheel, continuous and alternating pattern networks (EALR grade 4 # 1.1.1, 1.1.2)

**Grade:** 4 and up

**Materials:** White construction Paper (9x12 inches)  
Colored construction paper (12 x18 inches)  
Colored chalk (sealant)  
Pencil and eraser  
Ruler

**Procedure:**

1. Discuss with students the different types of patterns that maybe achieved just by varying color and or shape.
2. Using a ruler and pencil, have students divide white paper into equal squares or rectangles (remind students paper measures 9x12 inches). How can they divide it equally? What does each square measure? How many squares can they make?
3. Once students have their paper divided equally, they may now begin to decide what sort of pattern they wish to make and what colors to use (pastels, brights, warm colors etc.) or (circle inside of square, smaller square inside larger square etc.)

4. Glue finished artwork onto colored paper and trim as needed to create a frame.
