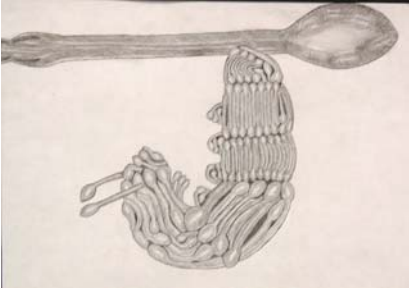

Common Object Animals

Step 1: Choose among a fork, a knife or a spoon (or any common objects the teacher chooses). Create a realistic drawing of your chosen object.

Step 2: Find a picture of an animal that you like. The entire animal should be seen in the picture. Make sure the picture is large enough to show the details of the animal. Draw a copy of the picture rendering the details to the best of your ability. Pay close attention to the structure of the animal as you draw it.

Step 3: On 12” x 18” sheet of paper, recreate your animal using the common object you chose earlier. It is important not to simply draw the outline of your animal and then just “fill it in” with pencils or spoons or forks; instead you should actually attempt to “build” your animal out of many of these objects (here is where understanding the structure of the animal pays off).

Step 4: Use color pencils to finish your art work. Layer different tints and shades of the same hue to create the illusion of three-dimensionality –this is called burnishing.
