North Kitsap School Board Meeting

April 12, 2018

The North Kitsap Board of Directors recognizes the outstanding achievements of our students and staff during this portion of the meeting. Student recognitions include those who achieve to a state or national level of academics, athletics or other school-sponsored activities.

### **Winter Athletics and Activities**

#### **Kingston High School**

**Gymnastics:** Head Coach: Sheila Moore; Volunteer Coaches: Lydia Moore, Reyne Yamane, Kristine Bacon, and Laurel Pardee.

Team Record: 2-2, 2-2. MVP: Mikka Yamane. Team GPA 3.76. The team scored a new KHS Gymnastics record with a 153.2 at the meet hosted by North Kitsap on January 25th. The team took 2nd place at Sub-Districts qualifying as a team to Districts, 2nd at Districts qualifying as a team to State, and 8th place at State.

Sub-District Results: Mikka Yame(12) 1st on Vault, bars, floor, and All-Around and 2nd on beam. Breckin Sontz (9) tie for 3rd Vault, tie 11th bars, 6th beam, 12th floor, tie 8th All-Around. Aunika Kramer (11) 8th bars. District Results: Mikka Yamane 3rd Vault, 1st bars, tie for 8th beam, 2nd floor, 2nd All-Around, Breckin Sontz 7th Vault, 8th All-Around.

State Results:

Mikka Yamane 6th on bars, 11th floor, tie 15th All-Around. State Team Competitors: Mikka Yamane (12), Breckin Sontz (9), Aunika Kramer (11), Annelise Pardee (11), Anna Quinn (10), and Cierra Frankin (11).

**Boys Swimming:** Head Coach Mark VanHuis, Assistant Coach Pam Manix.

Team record 6W-1L, League champions (3rd straight year), District Champions (3rd straight year), 3rd place Team at State. Team GPA 3.588, Team MVP Tim Gallagher.

At state we had 4 individual event champions, the 200 Medley Relay 3rd straight title (Tim Gallagher, Aron Markow, Quincy Walker, Ethan Fox), 200 Individual Medley- Tim Gallagher, 100 Backstroke- Tim Gallagher (2nd title), 400 Freestyle Relay (Ethan Fox, Bryce Hoffer, Quincy Walker, Tim Gallagher). We also had 8 other state finalist swims at the meet. 200 Individual Medley- Ethan Fox 2nd place, 100 Breaststroke- Aron Markow 2nd, 100 Freestyle- Ethan Fox 3rd place and Bryce Hoffer 13th place, 200 Freestyle Relay 4th place (Quincy Walker, Dave Andersen, Bryce Hoffer, Aron Markow), 50 Freestyle- Aron Markow 6th place, 100 Butterfly- Quincy Walker 6th place, 200 Freestyle- Bryce Hoffer 10th place. All four of our event champion swims were also 2A state meet records.

We also achieved All-American standards in 4 swims (200 Medley Relay, 200 Individual Medley, 100 Backstroke and 100 Breaststroke), All-American honors the top 100 times for each high school event in the nation, which is a very prestigious honor (only 8 All-American times were posted at the state meet).

In addition to our success in the swimming pool we also have had success in the classroom. Our state team's cumulative GPA is 3.588, which has helped us earn All-American Silver level scholar team status.

We have also started a dive team this year and our first 2 divers have helped us earn points in dual meets as well as the post season. One of our divers, Schuyler Berger, competed at both the district and state level in his first year.

**Girls Basketball:** Head Coach Charles Deam, Assistant Coaches Kendal Gill, Joann Joe, and Rick Menear. Team Record was 16-9 overall and 7-5 in league play with a 3rd place finish. Team G.P.A. was 3.32.

Qualified for Districts going 3-2 in postseason play with a 6th place finish at the district tournament while narrowly missing a birth to the Regionals round of play.

Kitsap Sun's first team all league players were Karleigh Gomez and Lily Beaulieu and Avy Hiner on the Second team.

**Boys Basketball:** Head Coach Jason Boyd, Assistant Coaches Mario Gonzales and Craig Gurney. Team Record 3-17. Captains Isaiah Calloway and Jacob Bradley. Offensive Player of the Year Popeh Chiquiti, Defensive Player of the Year Jacob Bradley and Most Inspirational Player Kyle Sheehy.

JV Record 5-14, C-Team Record 7-6.

**Wrestling:** Head Coach Casey Nelson, Assistant coach Peyton Reece. There were 3 active wrestlers during the competition season. Dalton Tellinghuisen placed in the top 3 at all regular season tournaments, second place at the sub regionals, and 5th place at the regionals making him an alternate to state. David Jensen was a first year wrestler who placed third in the sub regionals. Hunter Collins was knocked out of the season due to injury.

**Debate:** Head Coach Piper Ragland, Assistant Coach Brian Coyle. Debate took 5th Speaker in Public Forum at State (Thadeus Smith), 2nd Place in Impromptu at State (Elizabeth Ramirez), Team Academic State Champs in 2A (Team GPA), Top PO in Congressional Debate (Elizabeth) and State Champion Congressional Debate (Elizabeth) - only the 2nd time ever in WA State that has been achieved - which gave us enough points to win Team Sweepstakes in Congress.

Two students earned spots to go to Nationals in June in Ft Lauderdale FL competing with 3 students from Thomas Jefferson HS (Thadeus Smith and Seth Hillsberry) - the boys meet weekly with the Thomas Jefferson HS students to practice World Schools Debate which combines impromptu speech and debate with having a 20 minute prep in a small group format.

**Band:** Director Thomas Guenther. Annelise Pardee qualified for state solo contest on French Horn. Landon Nelson was selected as 1st alternate on Tenor Sax. Charlotte Hanson and Abby Brown's flute duet was selected as 2nd alternate. Regional contest was Feb 24. Additionally, the KHS Wind Ensemble earned straight "Superior" ratings at our band contest March 17!

**Drama:** Theatre Club just completed their Spring show of Almost, Maine. Over 20 students participated along with 10 ASL students providing interpretation. Theatre Club also recently participated in the Northwest Regional Theatre Festival. 12 students competed. 3 students received superiors (Ben Clifton in Costume

Design, Sophie Maio in Solo Musical, and Kit Ellsworth in Monologue). The Seniors are now showcasing their talent in the 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee playing June 1st and 2nd.
