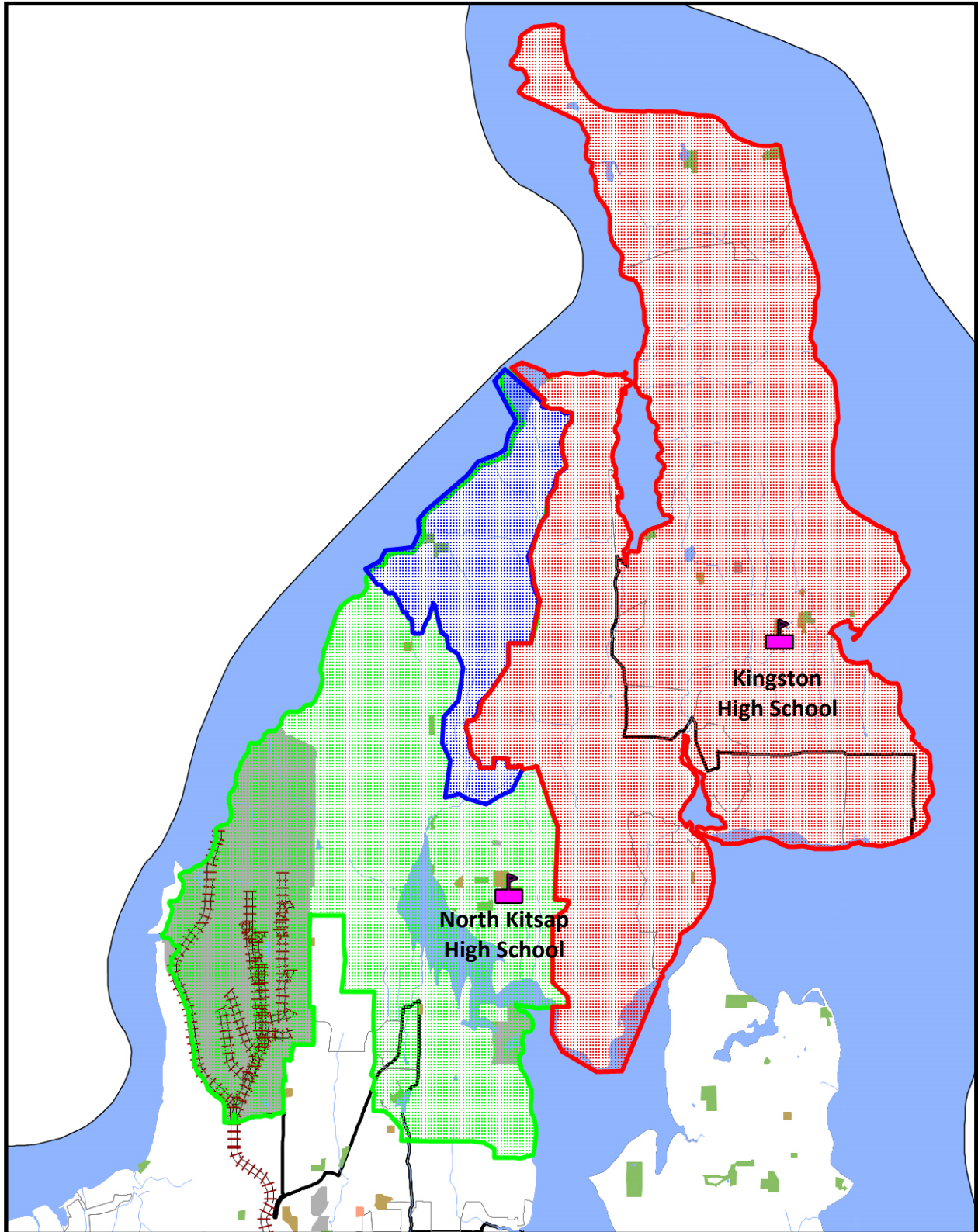


Proposed Boundary Adjustment

8th Grade - 20

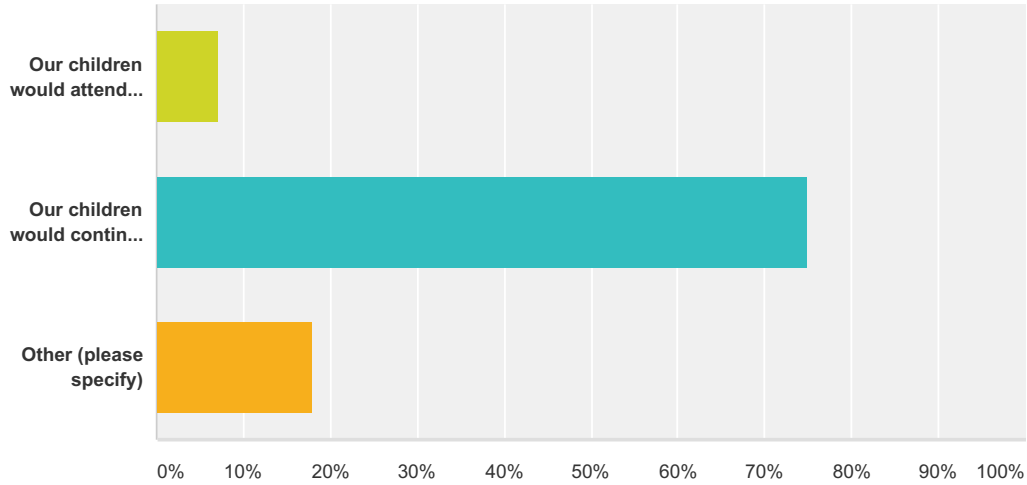
9th Grade - 19

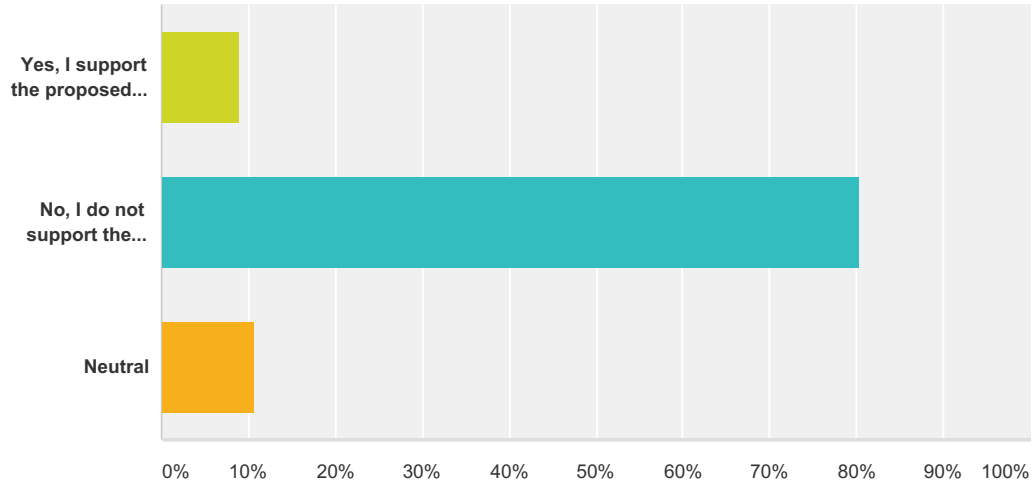
