Establishing the actual enrollment for Native American and Alaskan Native enrollment in the District is difficult. During school registration, parents may select their ethnicity. Many parents mark American Indian but a significant number mark two or more races. The more accurate count is the Title VII Tribal Affiliation (506 form) documentation collected annually. However, this number may miss some students claiming American Indian ethnicity but who cannot or choose not to provide documentation of their tribal affiliation.

Student Attendance During 2015-16

All Student Attendance Rate	94%
Native American/Alaskan Native Attendance Rate	89%

The average attendance rate for students can vary. During the 2015-16 school year, Native students missed on average 16 days but the range of absences were large: 68 students missed more than 25 days but 221 students missed less than 10 days. A few Students missing many days can skew the average for the group.
