- Budget Implication:** Within allocated curriculum budgets

Summary: This brief report is being provided to answer questions and requests made at the last meeting and to keep the school board aware during each step of the process towards a high school health material given the potentially sensitive topics that are included. Other materials are also in process as described. Attached is the last two years of data from the secondary materials needs survey as requested.

World Languages: Materials have been recommended by the IMC for French, German and Spanish and will be brought for board consideration on May 25th. Public viewing will occur leading up to the meeting on the 25th.

Social Studies: Teachers are reviewing several possibilities for AP World and AP US history books which are out of date. The IMC will hear recommendations from staff on June 1st. Recommendations may be brought to the school board at the June 8th or June 22nd meeting. Opportunities for public viewing will occur as texts are available for preview.

Health: The 2018 version samples of *Comprehensive Health* have arrived. Teachers are reviewing these currently and they will be made available for public viewing beginning the week of May 8th throughout the IMC consideration and board consideration process. Comments will be taken from the public and will be shared with the IMC during their review of the materials. Changes to *Comprehensive Health* from 2015 to 2018 are as follows:

1. Updated statistics about **life expectancy** and **leading causes of death**
2. Updated information about the **2015–2020 Dietary Guidelines**
3. Updated information and a complete lesson on the new rules for **Nutrition Facts labels**
4. New content about athletes' use of **performance-enhancing drugs**
5. New activities prompting students to further investigate the consequences of **opioid use**
6. New content about preventing and protecting one's self from **internet violence**, including **identity theft**
7. New information about recognizing, protecting one's self from, and advocating for the end of **human trafficking**
8. New information about the **Zika virus**
9. New information about **marijuana**

Comprehensive Health does contain content dealing with sexual health. School staff and IMC will determine whether the content is adequately aligned with state learning standards. School districts have the option about whether to teach sexual health. Our current board policy 2125 states that we will teach this strand of health education. This occurs in 5th grade, in middle school health classes, and at the high school level in health and health and wellness courses. When a district chooses to teach sex education, as we do, they are required to follow state guidelines. Part of those guidelines is that there must be an opportunity for parents to preview materials each year, and that students have the ability to opt out.

On May 18th, health teachers will provide a recommendation to the IMC regarding *Comprehensive Health*. If the staff recommends it, and if the IMC approves it, it could come to the school board for approval at either the June 8th or June 22nd meeting. Again, opportunities for public viewing and comment will be made available throughout the process, and the director of Curriculum and Instruction, Tim Garrison is happy to speak in person with anyone who has questions related to this topic.
