AUDIT SUMMARY

Results in brief

In most areas we audited, District operations complied with applicable requirements and provided adequate safeguarding of public resources. The District also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in most areas we examined.

However, we noted certain matters that we communicated to District management in a letter dated July 19, 2017, related to bidding requirements of public works projects. We appreciate the District's commitment to resolving those matters.

However, during the audit certain matters came to our attention that are currently under investigation.

About the audit

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of North Kitsap School District No. 400 from September 1, 2015 through August 31, 2016.

Management is responsible for ensuring compliance and adequate safeguarding of public resources from fraud, loss or abuse. This includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal controls relevant to these objectives.

Our audit involved performing procedures to obtain evidence about the District's uses of public resources, compliance with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures, and internal controls over such matters.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of fraud, loss, abuse, or noncompliance. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Donations
- Credit card disbursements
- Small and attractive assets
- Payroll
- Associated Student Body
- Procurement

INFORMATION ABOUT THE DISTRICT

North Kitsap School District No. 400 is located on the northern tip of the Kitsap Peninsula, which includes the communities of Poulsbo, Kingston, Hansville, Indianola and Suquamish. The District provides basic education and related services to approximately 6,065 students in kindergarten through 12th grade. The District operates six elementary schools, two middle schools, two high schools, the Spectrum Community School, West Sound Vocational Skills Center and the Running Start program with Olympic College.

An elected, five-member Board of Directors governs the District. The Board appoints a Superintendent to oversee the District's daily operations as well as its 860 employees. For fiscal year 2016, the District operated on an annual budget of approximately \$76 million.
