Summary: New USDA standards under the Healthy Hunger Kids Act (HHKA) requires each school district that participates in the National School Lunch Program or other federal Child Nutrition programs is required by federal law to establish a local school wellness policy for all schools under its jurisdiction and provide annual progress report with update of each school's progress in meeting wellness goals and a summary of wellness events and make that assessment available to the public.

Requirements:

- Designate one or more school official(s) to ensure Wellness Policy compliance at each school under its jurisdiction
- Make the Local Wellness Policy available to the public, encourage public comment and input
- Review and update the School Wellness Policy
- Make stakeholders aware of their ability to participate in the development, review, update and implementation of the Local Wellness Policy
- Provide annual progress report with update of each school's progress in meeting wellness goals and a summary of wellness events and make that assessment available to the public.
- Assess progress made in attaining goals and wellness policy compliance and compare to model wellness policies every three years

For the 2016-2017 school year, each school site was reviewed for compliance in meeting the goals outlined in the School Wellness Policy.

As the designated school official to ensure Wellness Policy compliance, I found all schools in compliance in meeting the goals outlined in the School Wellness Policy 6700 and for all food items sold during the school day.
